| | An explanation of why you chose to visit that particular landform/city/site |
| | Name of the landform (mountain, Mont Tremblant) |
| | A description of the landform/city/site (distinguishing characteristics) |
| | A map or a picture (including a caption) showing the landform/city/site. |
| | A written script of your presentation (handwritten or Google doc) |

EXTENSION: you may choose to include other interesting facts about the landform/city/site and surrounding area. You may also choose to include the relative location on each slide.
